The new date will be **April 30, 2022**. While we all look forward to this event, we must keep the safety of those attending foremost in our minds. Moving the auction out allows the current surge of the Omicron variant to subside, greatly reducing the likelihood of any attendees contracting COVID.

The Board appreciates your understanding and hopes the new date works for you. If you have already completed a pre-registration form and received your seller number, you will be able to use that number for the new date.

The latest news, as of the end of January, is that the number of cases of the Omicron strain of the virus are starting to subside rapidly in 41 states, including Minnesota. 



Yeah, it's February, winter is on the down slide, we are getting more daylight and hopefully the temps are warming up soon. Many of you are coming along on those winter building projects.

It seems that many of the new ARF's, or the foam planes are scale models now. The scale models are nice flying planes.


Have you ever thought about trying a warbird? They are great flying models, and most have the extra features of flaps and retracts. Retracts are very reliable with most being electric, but some air-operated. A couple of tips for using flaps and retracts. First with either one, don't extend them out while flying fast or at full power, reduce your speed to what you would use in the start of a downwind leg. Putting out flaps when going to fast puts lots of strain on you flap servos, strain on hinges, and probably will cause your models to pitch up. Too fast of an airspeed on your retracts can cause excessive pressure on your electric retract motors, more pressure on the gear doors and hinges and possibly keep the retract from locking into position. Most of these problems don't happen very often, but using good piloting skills will minimize these issues. Also, on some planes the gear mounting is not as strong as fixed gear, so be more gentle on your previously published in Flare Out, retracts.

Warbirds look great in the air, and for the most part are great flying models. If you are a little nervous about warbirds, start with one of the many foam models on the market. Remember, if buying a tail dragger especially, but any model, advance the throttle slowly, that helps take care of some of the torque or p-factor created by the prop. Warbirds offer the added complexity with the additional features that are fun to work with. A tip would be to look for a model that has a wide gear stance, such as a P-47 or most of the British Hawker models, Sea Fury, Typhoon, or even a you spell 'I loved it?'" FW - 190. These are easier to operate on the ground compared to a P-51, Spitfire or Me 109 with a narrow stance gear.

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Tupolev ANT-25

The January Mystery Plane was the Russian Tupolev ANT-25.



In the 1930's, almost all nations were interested in long-range flying records. The ANT-25 was fist flown in June 1933. The Tupolev was a long-range monoplane with a wingspan of 111-feet, 6-inches, and a speed of 163 mph. It was powered by an M34 R 12cylinder, liquid-cooled inline engine that developed 950 horsepower.

2021-2022 AMA Dues Statements

Most older TCRC members should have received their 2021-2022 dues statements in the mail this month from the Academy of Model Aeronautics. Newer members renew on the anniversary of the month they joined.

AMA 2022 dues are the same as the previous year. They are:

- Adult (19-65) \$75
- Senior (65 and up) \$65
- Under 19 Free or \$15 with *MA*

Your AMA membership gives you \$2.5 million in personal liability coverage, \$25,000 in medical coverage and also a subscription to either the print or digital *Model Aviation* for the year.

To belong to TCRC, you must have a valid membership for the year in AMA.


Please note that AMA also has a Park Pilot membership that has a cost of \$38 per year, but that membership is not valid for membership in TCRC.
