

#### **Blohm und Voss BV139**

The October Mystery Plane was the German Blohm und Voss BV 139.



For its newly-established transatlantic postal service, Lufthansa issued specifications for a new marine aircraft. It was required to both take-off and land in rough water, be suitable for catapult launch, and be able to carry 1,102 pounds of payload, for at least 3,107 miles.

A number of design studies were presented, and Blohm und Voss was awarded a contract for three prototypes. A specially developed Junkers Jumo diesel engine with 25% more power and 25% lower fuel consumption was provided, as compared to a conventional gas engine.

The first prototype flew in 1937. Two additional models were put into service between Horta Azores and New York. In three months, scheduled for Tuesday, November seven crossings were made using two depot ships. In November, 1938, the planes were updated with enlarged tail surfaces, and underwing radiators for engine cooling. At that time about 700 flying hours had been logged. At this time most of the planes were switched to a south Atlantic route. In 1939, all of these aircraft were transferred to the Luftwaffe, and refitted to primary mine laying roles, and troop transport, for use in the Norway invasion. The ultimate fate of these splendid aircraft was scrapping in 1944. The significance of these planes was they showed that the commercial age of aviation had arrived carrying mail and people across the oceans safely.

A brief reference to this aircraft was made in the 'air mail' column of the August, 2005 issue of *Flying Models*. This was not the world's largest float plane, rather refer to the Cant Z-511 for that honor.

The Blohm und Voss BV139 had a wingspan of 88 feet 7 inches, a weight of 38,530 pounds and a range of 3,293 miles. It was powered by fly safe, and try to land on the four 600 horsepower Junkers 205C diesel engines.

Hi TCRC'ers! How is your flying going this month?



New member Dave Kurschner had his Hanger 9 ARF Twist at the last membership meeting. This plane was covered with Yellow Ultrakote with purple trim. This plane is designed for aerobatics and had huge control surfaces and a fully-symmetrical wing. Dave had a Saito 82 4-stroke engine in it for power. The kit called for a .46-size 2-stroke. He bought the ARF at Hobby Warehouse for only \$89, and he said it was an easy plane to put together. He put the maiden flight on it on Sunday, October 8<sup>th</sup>, and loved how it flew. It took zero trim changes and was very responsive.

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#### **Novice Pattern**

For many years, TCRC held annual 'pattern' contests, and long-time member Chris O'Connor was a competitor in the contests during those years.

Now Chris is interested in acquainting current club members with 'pattern' and has given short presentations on pattern at the September and October meetings.

Chris has planned several more presentations at future meetings. To help Chris in this endeavor the *Flare Out* will do a series of articles on pattern over the next few months. It is hoped that these discussions and articles will create enough interest among the members that TCRC can hold a 'novice pattern' contest in the spring of 2006.

What is novice pattern? Novice pattern is a series of 10 maneuvers as prescribed by the AMA. These maneuvers are:

- 1. Take-off (U)
- 2. Straight Flight Out (U)
- 3. ½ Reverse Cuban-8
- 4. Straight Flight Back (D)
- 5. Stall Turn (U)
- 6. Immelmann Turn (U)
- 7. Split-S
- 8. 3 Inside Loops (U)
- 9. 1 Horizontal Roll (D)
- 10. Landing (U)

'U' denotes upwind and 'D' denotes downwind.

Plan on attending the membership meetings and watch the newsletter for pattern articles in the upcoming months.

## TCRC Elections November 8<sup>th</sup>

TCRC's elections will be held at the membership meeting on Tuesday, November 8<sup>th</sup>.

Six of the seven board seats are up for election this year – president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and two director positions.

Jay Bickford, TCRC president will not be running for re-election this year. Long-time member Jim Miller has agreed to run for the position but was hoping to see at least one other member also be a candidate.

Mike Timmerman and Jim Ronhovde's director seats are up for election. Mike has announced he will run again, and at press time Jim Ronhovde was undecided if he would run in 2006. In addition, Gerry Dunne and Dave Maurer have announced as candidates for board seats.

Scott Anderson holds the last director seat, but his seat is not up for election in 2006.

#### **AMA Executive Director Departs**

The Academy of Model Aeronautics Executive Council (EC), the governing body of the organization, and its Executive Director, Don Koranda, have reached a mutual decision not to renew Koranda's contract. This decision was made at the EC's quarterly meeting on October 15, 2005. It is effective immediately.

Longtime **AMA** employee Joyce Hager has been appointed staff director and will oversee the day-to-day operations until an interim executive director has been named. "Joyce is an accomplished executive who is well-prepared to fill the association's immediate staff leadership needs while a replacement executive director is sought." said AMA president Dave Brown. "We are very fortunate that she is willing to assume this position."

The EC has appointed a threeperson search committee charged with locating qualified candidates and making a recommendation to the council. Committee members include the chairman, Richard Hanson (District X), and members Andy Argenio (District I), and Dave Mathewson (District II). Joyce Hager will function as a staff liaison to the committee.

The committee's search may take as long as one year. "Reaching consensus on expectations of an executive director and finding the right person is much more important than filling that permanent position quickly", Brown said. Koranda's departure follows 10 months at the helm of the 165,000-member "I knew the risks association. when I accepted this position and have absolutely no regrets", Koranda said recently in a E-mail to staff and the EC. "I also have no doubt about the direction in which AMA needs to go to meet its full potential. In my view, we accomplished a lot in 10 months."

"We will miss the vision Don brought to AMA, and we will do our best to continue many of the programs Don initiated during his tenure", Brown said.

November is AMA election month. This year, the nation office of Executive Vice President is up and the District VP offices in Districts III, VII and XI. TCRC is in District VII.


The District VII VP incumbent is Bill Oberdieck and he is running unopposed this year.
