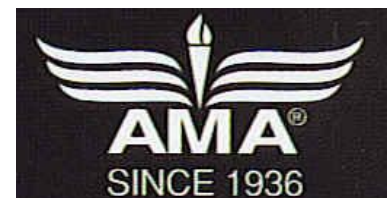
concession area is being increased and we've added more holding rooms. More tables are coming from another church and the club wives have the "kitchen" space under control. Thanks again to the auction committee.

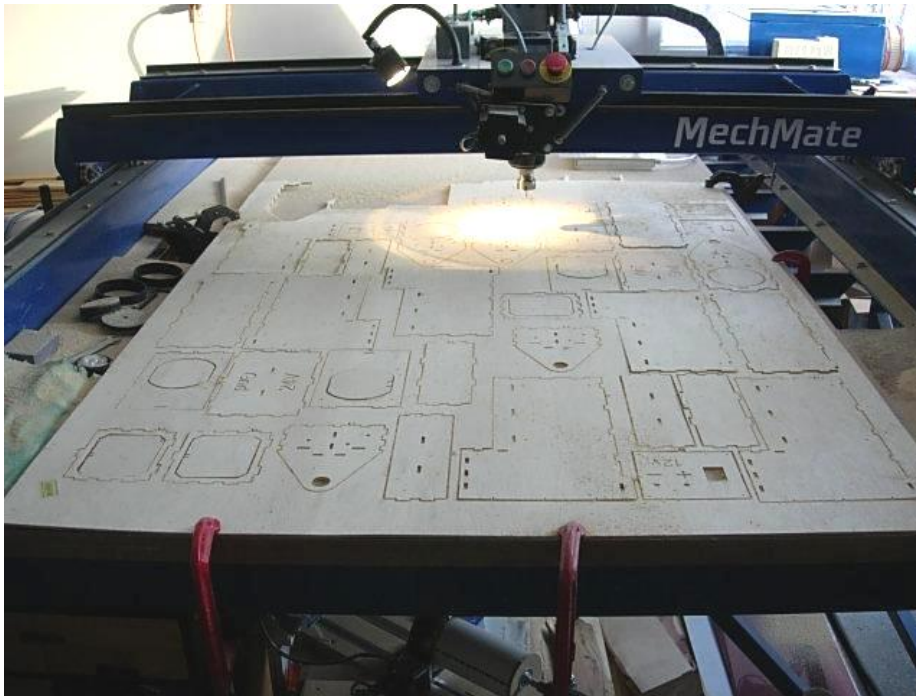

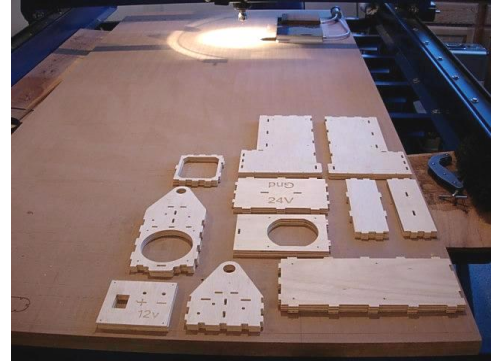

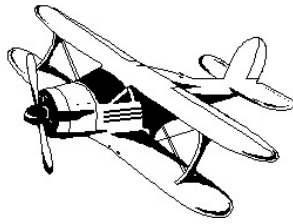

The January TCRC membership meeting was full of airplanes.



Paul Doyle started the new year with a new plane. This was a Park Zone Habu ARF electric. The foam plane was done in gray with blue and yellow trim. The battery was a 4-cell lipo 3300 mah and with the stock ducted fan motor it flew out of the box around 90 mph. Paul felt it was a nice flyer.



Gerry had a very nice Stealth Fighter ARF electric from Easy Tiger. It was done in authentic stealth gray and had mechanical retracts. It weighed it at 2 pounds 2 ounces. Gerry needs a runway for the maiden flight.



Gerry, in his ongoing effort to replace his electric fleet had a GWS P-51 ARF electric for pylon racing. It had a white foam fuse with red on the nose, tailfeathers and wing tips.

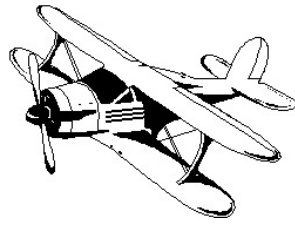


Tim Len had a Hobby Lobby F-4 ARF foamy done in green and brown camo. This ducted fan weighed in at 2 pounds 8 ounces and the 7-blade ducted fan motor developed 2 pounds 13 ounces of thrust. This fighter has not flown yet.

Mile Burk (see photo on page 6, column 1) had a GWS Slow Stick that had been modified to be powered by twin electric motors. Sitting on the nose was a flight camera capable of rotating 180 degrees side to side and 90 degrees down. Once Mike receives his goggles for his receiver, he will be able to fly this without seeing the plane. His view will be from the nose of the plane. He is hoping to receive the goggles so that he can try the plane out very soon.

Joe Neidermyr had a very nice German Stuka U87 dive bomber done in black/green camouflage with a yellow cowl and rudder. The underside of the wing was light blue. This ARF electric was from Thunder Tiger and weighed in a less than 16 ounces. The nice looking plane has not flown as yet.



Larry Couture had an ARF Sonic by Phoenix Models. This plane was done in white kote with red and blue trim with the underwing black and white checkerboard. The Sonic was designed for a glow engine but Larry had converted it to electric. Complete with snow skis the plane weighed in at 4 pounds. The batteries were a pair of 2200 mah 3-cells set up in parallel. The plane was supposed to fly on January 2<sup>nd</sup> but the very cold weather moved the maiden flight next week, if the warm up continues.

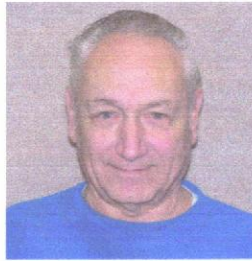

Wayne has flown this plane and it flies very nicely. He plans to have this become a permanent seaplane as soon as he gets the floats on it. J

## 2010 AMA Dues Statements

AMA 2010 dues have not changed from the previous year. They are:

- Adult (19-65) \$58
- Senior (65 and up) \$48
- Under 19 \$1  
or \$15 with *MA*
- Additional family \$30

Your AMA membership gives you \$2.5 million in personal liability coverage, \$25,000 in medical coverage and also a subscription to *Model Aviation* for the year.

To belong to TCRC, you must have a valid membership for the year in AMA.

Please note that AMA also has a Park Pilot membership that has a cost of \$29.95 per year, but that membership is not valid for membership in TCRC.

To renew your membership in AMA, the Academy gives you four methods: at the AMA website, [www.modelaircraft.org](http://www.modelaircraft.org); by fax at (765) 741-0057; by phone at (800) 435-9262; or by returning the renewal form you received in the mail in the supplied envelope.

Our prayers and best wishes go out to Paul, Jan and his family.

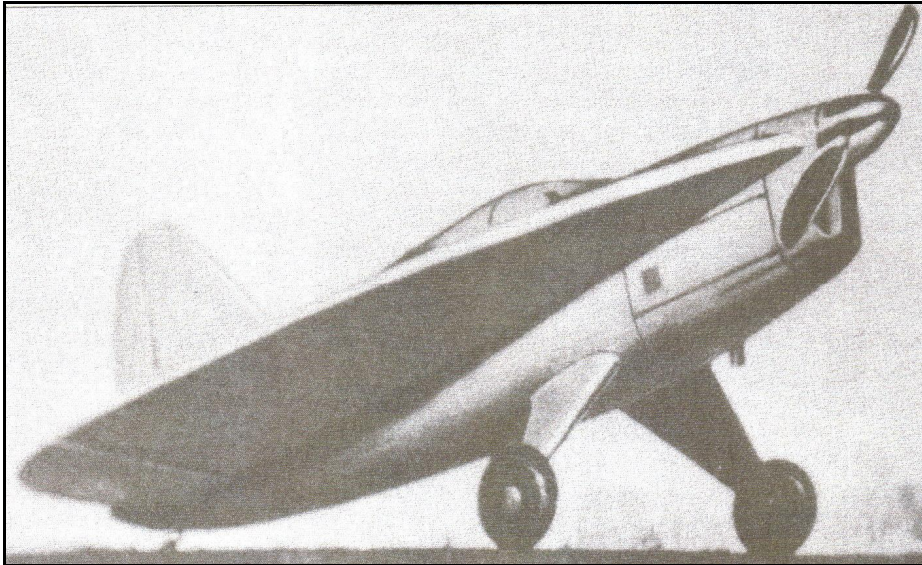

# Moskalyov SAM 9 Strela (Arrow)

The January Mystery Plane was the Russian Moskalyov SAM 9 Strela.



Aleksander Moskalyov, a talented young Russian designer/pilot, while starting out designing conventional airplanes, was obsessed to work on unconventional tail-less airplanes, preferably with high speed capabilities. His first plane was the Sigma 7, which did not meet with any success and was not produced. In 1936, U. S. magazines were full of articles featuring futuristic fighters. The GUAP (which oversaw all Russian air activities, sort of like our CAA-FAA) gave the go-ahead to Moskalyov for a simple plane, with modest horsepower.

Following wind tunnel tests, the SAM 9 was built in 70 days, and was flight-tested on skis. The plane was of wooden construction, with cable-controlled, fabric-covered rudders and elevons. It sported a neat side hinged canopy. The main gear consisted of rubber sprung cantilever legs, and could be fitted for either wheels or skis. It had a plywood covering, and was super smooth. Unfortunately, it required a 22 degree angle of attack for both takeoff and landing! The reason for this was never fully known. While flight tests were satisfactory, for the most part, the plane could not, for some reason, attain more than 4,900 feet of altitude! Anyway, no production followed.

A recent aircraft museum display featured a SAM 9 plane. It had a mirror-like scarlet finish and looked pretty sharp.

The SAM was powered by a Renault MV4 inverted, air-cooled 4-cylinder engine that developed 140 horsepower. It had a wingspan of 11.5 feet, a gross weight of 1,389 pounds and a cruising speed around 140 mph. ☺

- Junior \$37.50

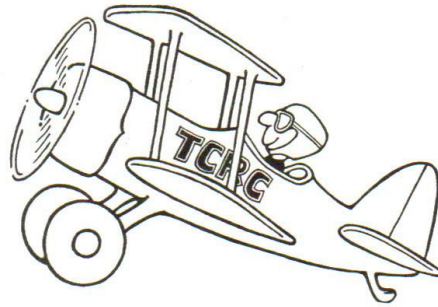

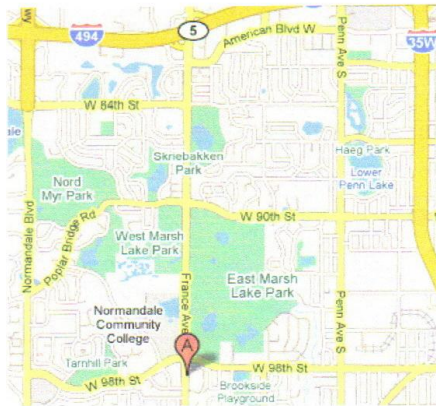

# More TCRC Service Awards Given At Meeting

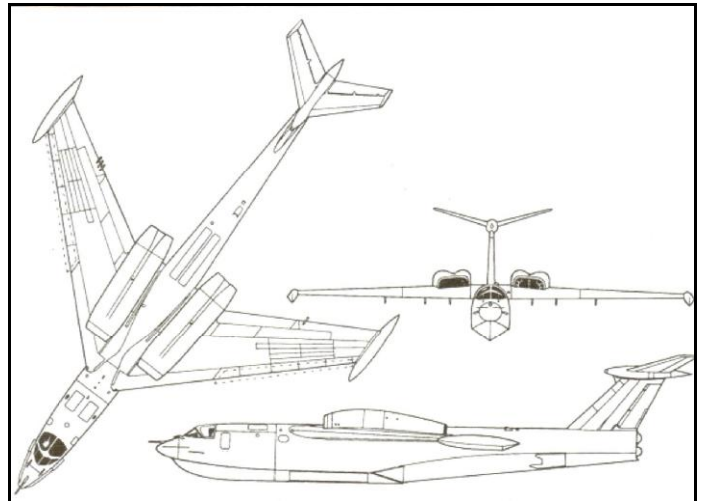
Club historian Scott Anderson and president Steve Meyer gave out more TCRC service award patches at the January meeting.
