39th TCRC Auction Is February 7th

Saturday, February 7th is the 39th Annual TCRC Auction. That's just one month away! If you are planning on selling a lot of items at the auction, or even just a few, webmaster Pat Dziuk has the registration program running on the club website, TCRCOnline.com. Using this pre-registration on the website is extremely helpful to the club and will help to lessen the congestion that occurs at the buyer and seller registration tables just inside the doors of the church. President Bob and VP Corey both stress in their articles in this newsletter the very great need the club has in getting EVERY MEMBER possible to work at this event. And not just the members, but spouses, older children, and friends are also welcomed with open arms. If you have not already signed up to work the auction, we can use help at the buyer and seller registration, the impound area, the concessions, recording, cashier, moving products to and from the stage, spotters and clean-up -- just about everywhere. We will be reviewing all of the auction needs at the January 13th membership meeting, and will have a sign-up sheet available. Please don't miss this meeting!

If you are new to the auction, the general rules are that:

- Admission is \$4 for everyone
- All items are for R/C flying.
- Minimum opening bid is \$20
- Incremental bids are \$5 minimum
- Sellers can protect their item by being final bidder.
- Buybacks are 10% up to a maximum of \$20.
- Decisions of the auctioneer are final.

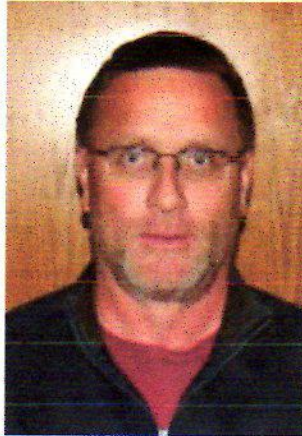

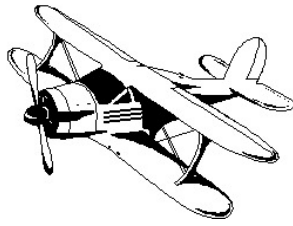

Mark Wolf had his giant-scale Stinson Reliant SR-9 at the meeting, showing the progress he has made on the construction of this plane. It is a Top Flite kit and had a 100-inch wingspan. The power plant will be either a Saito FG-36 gas or an OS FT-160 glow. The Reliant had flaps and the servos were going to be either Hitec or JR digitals. Mark has done a beautiful job on the construction and it will be exciting to see the finished product.

Sherwood Heggen had his new plane at the meeting. It was a Quickie 500 that he scratch-built from plans. It was covered with cream and black Ultrakote with red trim and weighed in at 3-1/4 pounds. It had a 50-inch wingspan. Sherwood actually came in possession of the plane after it had been framed up, but it took lots of Sherwood's TLC to bring it to the state it is now in. For power he had an OS Max 25 swinging a 10 x 4 prop. The maiden flight is scheduled to occur in green grass in Minnesota.

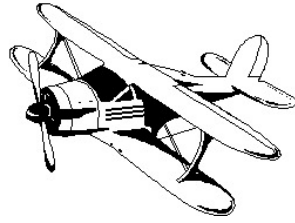

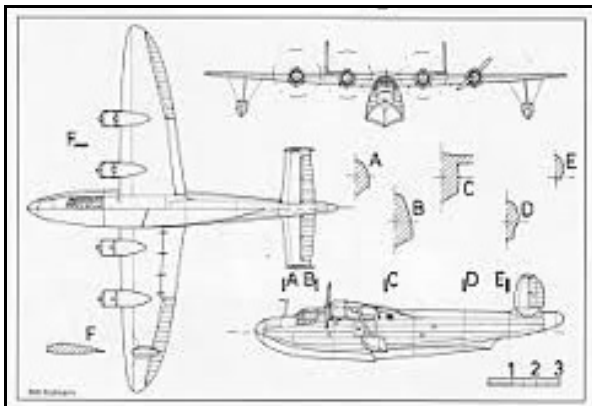
Wayne Rademacher had a pair of 'racing quadcopters at the meeting. (See photo on page 5, column 2). I do not have any information as to the manufacture,etc.

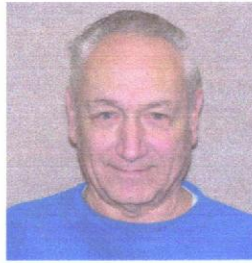

Now if all the rules are followed to the letter of the law and everyone makes sure that their equipment is in perfect shape and they never have a failure, or that all flights end with perfect landings then none of this equipment or knowledge thereof would be needed, but that is not going to happen in the real world that we are in.

So instead we must practice and use the rules every day that we fly. I think that the best thing we can all do is LOUDLY tell everyone and WAIT FOR A RESPONSE when we taxi out, takeoff, make touch and goes, low fly-bys and last but not least landings or for sure the dead stick landings which by their need take preference over all other movements.

As usual all landings from which you can fly again are great but not always graceful so fly often and keep the rubber side down. J

2015 TCRC Dues

2015 AMA Dues Statements

All TCRC members should have received their 2015 dues statements in the mail in September from the Academy of Model Aeronautics.

AMA 2015 dues have not changed from the previous year. They are:

- Adult (19-65) \$58
- Senior (65 and up) \$48
- Under 19 \$1
or \$15 with *MA*
- Additional family \$30

Your AMA membership gives you \$2.5 million in personal liability coverage, \$25,000 in medical coverage and also a subscription to *Model Aviation* for the year.

To belong to TCRC, you must have a valid membership for the year in AMA.

Please note that AMA also has a Park Pilot membership that has a cost of \$29.95 per year, but that membership is not valid for membership in TCRC.

To renew your membership in AMA, the Academy gives you four methods: at the AMA website, www.modelaircraft.org; by fax at (765) 741-0057; by phone at (800) 435-9262; or by returning the renewal form you received in the mail in the supplied envelope.

Deadline for paying your 2015 AMA dues is December 15 to avoid a lapse in membership services. **J**

Sikorsky S-43

The December Mystery Plane was the Russian Sikorsky S-43.



Igor Sikorsky is well known to airplane enthusiasts, and is responsible for a great number of significant aircraft in the aviation world. It started with an amazing 4-engine bomber in 1913, the "LeGrand". Sikorsky was the pilot, designer and engineer. The plane flew for 1 hour, 54 minutes, with 8 people aboard. The plane completed 53 trouble free flights. The Sikorsky saga continued up through the Viet Nam conflict.

In the 30's, Sikorsky designed several great flying boats, the most well-known were the S-38, 39 and 41. Well-known was the S-42, a 4-engine flying boat, which pioneered both Atlantic and Pacific trans-oceanic passenger flights. The S-43, a twin-engine amphibian was patterned after the S-42, and called the "Little Clipper". It first flew in 1935.

The S-43 was a parasol-winged, all-metal plane, designed for up to 18 passengers, and used a number of engines. It could be reconfigured from passengers to freight quickly. It was used by many airlines, and the U.S. Navy, and the Army Air Corps. Per pilots' reports, it was a good flyer. A total of 20 planes were built. Among such planes as the S-38 and 9, was the very well-known UH-60, "Black Hawk" helicopter. All told, about 20 major models were Sikorskys.

Note: At the Northern Alliance meet, I had occasion to talk with Carl Bachhuber, who had a large-scale model of the S-43. I ventured a guess that it was an S-43, with engines of "around 6 to 700 horsepower". He told me that I was the first to identify it as the S-43. I did first say S-41. Wrong! Anyway, it was a beautiful airplane and flew terrific, as all his planes do.

The S-43 was powered with two Pratt & Whitney R-1690 9-cylinder, air-cooled engines each developing 750 to 875 horsepower. It had a wingspan of 86 feet, a gross weight of 19,096 pounds, a speed of 190 mph and a range of 775 miles. J

Cleary Lake Model Air Park Progresses

The possibility of an R/C Model Air Park in the Cleary Lake Regional Park in Prior Lake moved one step closer in December.

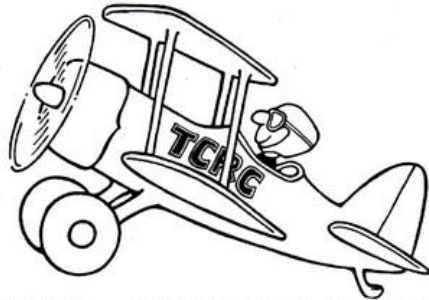
Previously the Scott County Park Board had voted to support the concept of establishing an R/C model aviation park at Cleary Lake. However, progress stalled when it appeared that the County would not grant a road access to that area of the park where the air park would be.

Joe Neidermayr received a memo stating that if the owner of the land, which is the Three Rivers Park District, petitioned the County for the access, the County would authorize that access.

This is great news, but a hurdle still exists, and that is the Three Rivers Park District must agree with the County's recommendation for the air park and vote to approve it.

Modelers from around the area have done a great job twice to show the need and support that such a park has, but those modelers will probably be called on again to show that support and help persuade the Three Rivers Park District. J

To be an AMA All Season Flyer, a pilot must put a plane in the air outside in every month of a calendar year. That means you must start in January to qualify for 2015. Earning an All Season flyer patch (see page 6) in Minnesota is a pretty prestigious accomplishment. There are several members of the club that have done this continuously for considerably more than 10 years.

The ASF pilots try to make it easy to get your flight in in the cold weather months by organizing special days where several members meet each cold month. Saturday, January 3rd is such a day.


When the All Season Flyer day is scheduled, the 10-10-10 rule is in play. That is, if at 10 AM the temperature is +10 degrees or higher and the wind is 10 mph or lower, than the event will occur.
